We have numerous competitions running where children are invited to submit posters, short movies and poetry focussing on the 5Cs and our positive friendship messages. Classes have also engaged in further discussions and activities around our focus of positive friendships.



Year 4 Faith student, Max Butler wrote, "Commonsense is: if you are being bullied, you do not have to try and deal with it all on your own. Sometimes an adult might be needed to sort things out. Care is: If you see someone being bullied you could care for that person by trying to help them. You should consider what it would be like for the person being bullied. I am happy that we have the 5Cs at Faith. We can work together to make a difference in the world."


