Faith Lutheran College, Redlands offers students a broad spectrum of learning opportunities in a supportive Christian-centred environment.

### **Early Phase of Learning**

The transition from home to school is an important phase in a student's life. The Early Years program at Faith (Prep) focuses on providing experiences for students, in the areas they need to learn about, to be successful at school. The areas of learning include:

- Christian, social and personal learning;
- Literacy and communication;
- Mathematical understandings (Numeracy);
- Health and physical learning; and
- How to be an active learner.

## The Middle Phase of Learning

The Middle Phase of Learning starts in Year 7 and extends to Year 9. At FLC,R the focus is on developing literacy and numeracy skills in a Christian informed setting. The Australian Curriculum Learning Areas of Mathematics, English, Science, History and Geography plus the Queensland Essential Learnings (The Arts, LOTE and Technologies) form the basis of the curriculum. There is also a focus on developing a broad general education that includes:

- Christian, social, and cultural learning; and
- Aesthetic learning.

During the Middle Phase of Learning, the aim of the College is to engage and motivate students by offering a relevant curriculum that fosters in children a desire to learn and achieve academic success

### **Senior Phase of Learning**

The Senior Phase of Learning at Faith focuses on enabling students to realise their aspirations for the future through multiple pathways.

Students start to choose their pathways in Year 10. In Year 11 and 12, they specialise to gain access to further education and/ or employment. Students also develop understandings and skills that allow them to participate as informed members of Australian society.

Along with an outstanding academic curriculum there is a range of vocational opportunities offered to Faith students. All students are able to attain a Queensland Certificate of Education at the end of the Senior Phase of Learning and, if it suits their educational goals, an OP that gains them access to further study.
