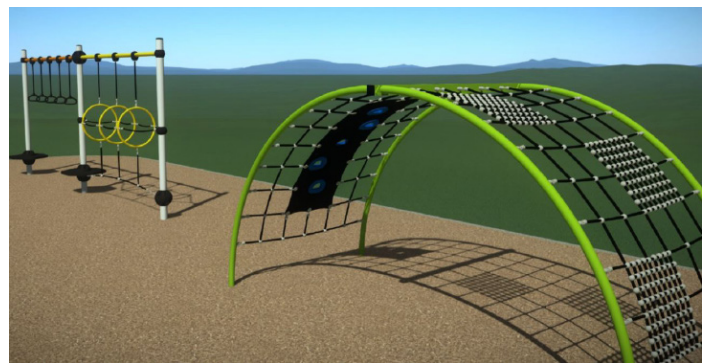
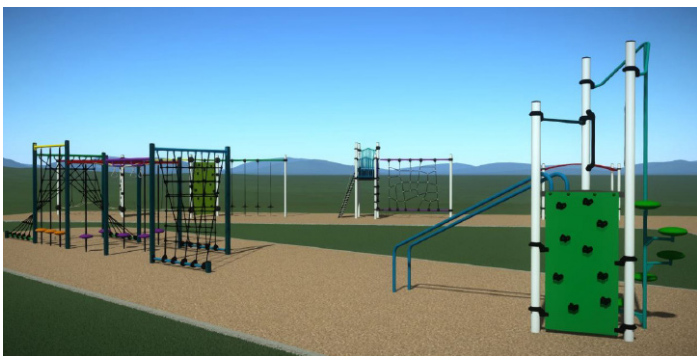

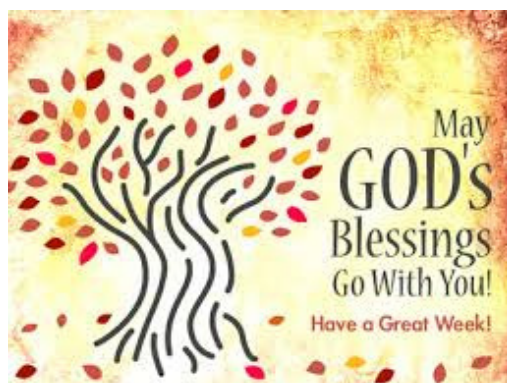
The pictures below are computer models of what it will look like once in place. Please keep an eye out for information sent to families soon with further information about the installation.

INAUGURAL YEAR 6 CANBERRA TOUR – At the end of last term our Year 6 students visited Canberra for an education tour of the national capital. Students were given the opportunity to participate in a variety of educational programs with a focus on Australia's history, culture, heritage and democracy. The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government is contributing funding of \$60 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs (factored into the Tour fee). The rebate is paid directly to the school upon completion of the excursion.
