



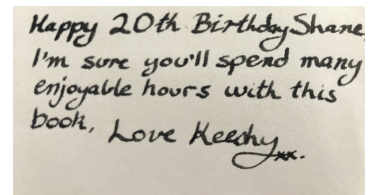
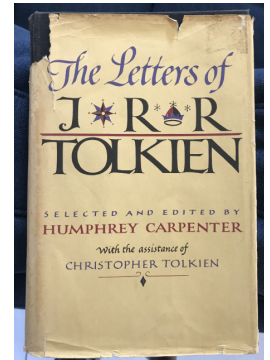

## Book Week...

I love books. I have read thousands of them and I own hundreds of them. I have put it on record previously that I am a Tolkien tragic. I fell in love with the works of JRR Tolkien as a lad and, with my slightly obsessive nature, went on to amass a collection of his works the likes of which I have not seen anywhere since. I think I have 14 or 15 separate versions of The Hobbit alone. Illustrated, annotated, 50th anniversary edition, 60th anniversary edition, audio version, BBC radio play version, gilt leaf leather bound version ... the list goes on and I won't wax too lyrical about that amazing author and his created world this time around.

I will however refer to one very special book that resides in my Tolkien collection. I have a hard cover copy of The Letters of JRR Tolkien Edited by Humphrey Carpenter. It is what it sounds like, a simple compilation of many of the letters of JRRT that were written right through his life from around the time of the writing and publication of The Hobbit in the early 1930's. It is really interesting to read his thoughts and encouragements to his family, friends and fans as he rose in fame and popularity, as the Lord of the Rings went to publication and he became a best-selling author and so on. He was a profound thinker and an enormous intellect and these elements of his character shine through in his writings. But the reason I love this book is because it was given to me by a very good friend back when I was young and beautiful at University (or Teacher's College as it was in those days).

I have included a picture of the book with this article as well as the inscription that my friend wrote all those years ago. At the time, we were both poor students and my burgeoning Tolkien collection probably had a dozen books in it. My friend, whom I had nicknamed Keeshy, was working in a bookstore over the holidays to have some money to spend on our wild and reckless university student lifestyle at the time. I still recall the moment when she gave me the book, I know it would have cost a fair bit back in those days, say the equivalent of about \$50 or \$60 now, and that was a lot of money for a Uni student. I was in equal parts shocked, thankful, and humbled that one of my friends would do that for me. The book became an instant treasure and still is. Of all the things I have, all the bits and pieces I have amassed, and there is a fair bit, it remains one of my favourite things. I just love it.



So, this year I turned 50 and I have now had that book for 30 years. I have gone back to it again and again variously over the years for relaxation, inspiration, reminiscence and at some level even guidance as I read the advice that Tolkien gave to his family and friends who sometimes faced the same sorts of challenges that face us all from time to time.

Wouldn't it be good if there was this one book, a special book? If each of us had that book. A volume where we could go again and again for relaxation, inspiration, comfort, guidance ... Ah, yes ... that's right!

I hope you enjoy Book Week, I trust that you find joy in reading, that you make time to settle into a book sometime soon and that you find something special in the writings of The One who gave us His Book.

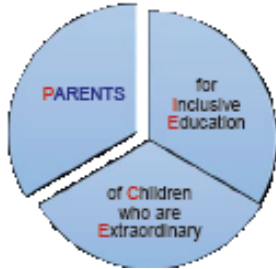

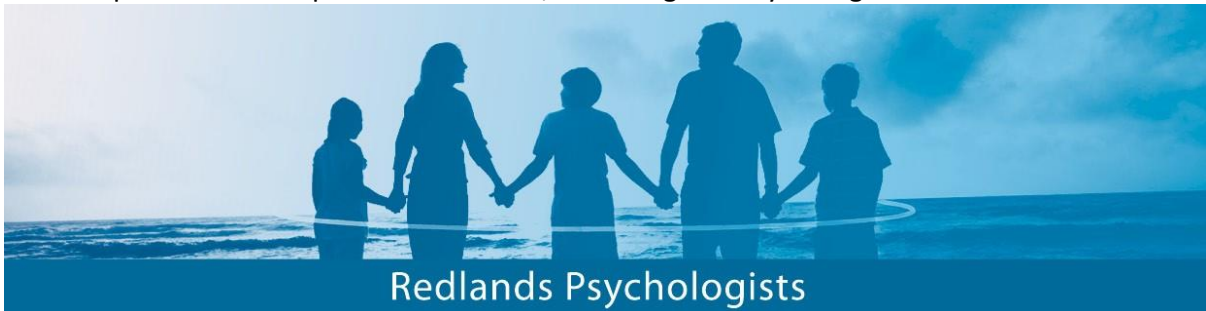
